It's 2011, but I guess you already know that. New years bring new ideas, new officers and a feeling that this is going to be the best year ever. Positive thinking. I love it. I sincerely hope it turns out to be the best year ever for you and for your chapters and for the entire District. We can make it so.

I'm really excited about one particular project that's in the works, which I mentioned in my January email. I think we should be rolling it out across the District by the Spring and I'm hoping it will be successful everywhere. It's a recruitment program that's been tested in England, and by the Sweet Adelines and in a number of chapters across the country and will cash in on the increasing popularity of A capella singing. People love to sing but don't know how or where to go. We're going to help them. Stay tuned.

What an amazing Midwinter Convention we just hosted in the Far Western District, with the help of the Las Vegas Metro Chapter and other barbershoppers. It was a great start to the year with almost 2,500 people there. That's almost 50% more than Tampa last, the highest ever attendance at that time. It was truly a mini International. In the youth chorus contest, 650 young men sung in 19 choruses. What I love most is that nobody tells those kids they have to do this. They love it. That's why they never go to bed. They just sing in the lobbies and hallways and in their rooms ... all night! The top two choruses scored higher than many a District Champion Chorus (well actually, the winning chorus is already a District Champion, modeled after our very own Westminster Chapter). Four FWD choruses competed and two placed in the top ten. Kudos to all who

promoted and helped. I wish there was room to mention them all.

While in Las Vegas, I attended several meetings, including District Presidents' meetings and a first ever joint meeting between us and the Society Board, where lots of interesting things were discussed. Last year there was a proposal to change the International Chorus Contest so that each chorus would have to sit out every second year. The proposal was not popular and has now been dropped. It will not be sent to the Society Board for a vote.

I appointed three new District leaders on January 1st, who I talked about in my January email. They each have ideas that they want to bring to the table and I think we are going to see some benefits during the year. They are John Minsker (Chorus Director Development), Jack Peters (Member Services) and Greg Titus (Marketing & PR). They took over from Dave Tautkus, Clark Abrahamson and Dan Jordan. all of whom we thank sincerely for all of their prior work. I have a feeling the new guys will be looking for men to help them in their jobs as the year progresses. If you're interested in offering your services for the benefit of the District, they will be happy to hear from you.

Our next convention will be the Spring Convention in Santa Clara, hosted by the Bay Area Chapter. We are hoping to have a web cast for the first time at a Spring Convention but that shouldn't stop you from being there. The venue is excellent and the quality of singing will be the best in the country. After that will be the Division Conventions in Phoenix, Pasadena, Primm and Modesto, Make your plans now. Some extra treats will be in store for you.

There is no doubt that the Barbershop Harmony Society is over the worst. Membership declines have slowed considerably and the Society returned an excellent profit in 2010. That means there will be money for better recruitment drives, better leadership training, more help for youth programs and better conventions. What a great hobby we have.

It's hard to believe, but 2011 is upon us and we'll be starting the divisional contest cycle very soon. There are several chapters in the FWD that are suffering from lack of attendance, direction and focus and the inability to decide what they want to be when they grow up. I've talked with leaders of those chapters and apathy is the descriptive word relating to the chapter personality. It seems like people just have too many other things to do instead of attending the chapter meeting on a weekly basis and the organizations are dwindling in size and losing the momentum necessary to provide an environment for men to enjoy barbershop harmony.

In Arizona Ted Sayle, Ivan Jensen and Russ Young have made an attempt to help one of the division chapters by calling a special board meeting and suggesting that a couple of the larger chapters could offer their quartets to help put on a show and maybe salvage the organization. However, the leaders were very skeptical about asking and seem to feel that without a full-time director and the large percentage of snow birds that make up the chorus they are doomed.

That gets me back to the Chapter Service Representative program that is not being called upon except in a few instances during the past year. It seems like our chapters are reluctant to ask for help....and when they do it's almost for certain that their minds are made up for failure.

What can we do to encourage the FWD chapters to request help from a group of qualified volunteers who have expertise in almost any issue facing a chapter? I'd like to hear from you if you have suggestions because without knowing where to send our CSR's we are stymied.

Making the simple complicated is commonplace; making the complicated simple, awesomely simple – that's creativity.

Let's try to get a little creative in our solutions to chapter retention and growth by utilizing the tools available to us here in the FWD. We're here to help and while the goal is to "keep the whole world singing" we need to start in our own chapters. Give it a try and see what results with the effort.

I would like to thank Bernard for inviting me to be a part of this progressive 2011 FWD leadership team.

For the coming year, it's my intention to post specific ideas in each Westunes editions, that will help grow our membership. Remember, "There's nothing new under the sun," and it's impossible for me to know what you presently do, have tried, or not tried. In this regard, allow me the privilege of sharing some concepts that work to bring in and retain new members. I'm anxious to hear your ideas too and will share them with all of our brothers. Don't be shy. I'll even post where they came from!

Here's a couple of easy things that seem to work consistently well in this joyful task of attracting new members:

- (1) Always carry chapter business cards- with times and location of your chapter meetings. When in a line waiting for something or anywhere you might be, you may hear a voice speaking that sounds like he could be a singer. Don't' let him get away but ask if he's ever sung! If he hasn't, maybe he should, maybe he would, or does he know someone who might be interested in singing with a group of men?? Now you need a hook here. An invitation and card is given and ---- "I'll have a free CD of our music to give you just for visiting our next meeting." or ---? S/O's can also do this, doubling the chapters' exposure factor.
- (2) Wear your chapter logo'd apparel in public. It seldom fails to raise a question of;

"What is that organization?" Hello!

(3) Most have had some experience in music sometime in their lives.

Bruce Giddens, the fella who invited me to my first chapter meeting 18 years ago, simply asked me in casual conversation--- if I had *ever played an instrument*. It's a good question, because the chances are pretty good that if one has played;

- (a) He probably doesn't play now and will be free to try something new.
- (b) He'll know something about performing, harmony, tuning and music in general. Hmmm!

A perfect lead into our sport of singing with a group and he:

- (a) Won't need a physical instrument to lug around.
- (b) He can rehearse without blowing out the neighborhood.
- (c) He can do it until he's ---?
- (d) He will no doubt, live longer and certainly better! Remember this – We don't need soloists!

(4) Develop a "Tag Team" - at your chapter meetings who are always ready with a couple of killer tags to share with a new guy. When you have a visitor, the Tag Team puts the visitor into a part. The BBS brother of that part stands out and assists until the visitor can stand on his own. You learn a lot about your visitor without ever asking a question, and he gets a hook in his mouth.

Membership – to continue with Clark's Winter 2010 Westunes' Membership article: It's imperative that each of us continually promote our sport, not just me, not just your Membership VP, but You, me, yes-- all of us. Share the joy of ringinachord! Why not ?! New blood is healthy and necessary for anything to survive and progress.

Why I call what we do, a "sport", and the new "key" to unlocking old preconceived ideas! Stay in touch.

The "after-glow" from the International Midwinter convention in Las Vegas January 28-29 will undoubtedly permeate our barbershop lives well into the future. record attendance of some 2,400 was driven by the presence of over 650 young men who participated in the 4th annual International Youth Chorus Festival-double the year before—which left more than just this passionate observer with a damp cheek or two.

The future is here, now. And how!

Of the 19 youth choruses competing, four, with some 120 singers, were from the Far Western District. Sacramento (after an all-night bus ride) came The Really Big Quartet (with 43 on stage) directed by Ron Black, Gabe Caretto, and Jason Dyer. From Phoenix came Arizona Spirit, directed by Dan Ryan Sr. From San Diego came Pacific Suns, directed by Allan Webb. And Las Vegas provided The Silver Statesmen, directed by Jim Halvorson and Jay Dougherty. They all did us proud. The Really Big Quartet and Arizona Spirit finished second and third, respectively, in the AA plateau (average age under 21).

No doubt you'll be hearing many wonderful stories about this experience. And next year, this event will be in Tucson. Does that suggest we might just have twice as many youth choruses involved next year? Oh, the dilemma!

High School, College Quartets

Four Hall of Famers Pass Away in 2010

During the period from April 13th through mid-December 2010 four members of the Far Western District Hall of

Fame passed away. This is a huge loss to the district and all of these men will be missed. Their information has been previously distributed throughout the district so I will not go over a lot of details, but I do want to make our readers aware of the impact that these four men had on the Far Western District. The accomplishments of these four gentlemen that we list below are only partial lists.

Dick Girvin passed away on April 13, 2010 after a short illness. He was a 40 year member of the Society (SPEB-SQSA) and had held many leadership positions during his barbershop career. Chapter: Bulletin Editor, Secretary, Show Chairman, President. District: Area Counselor, WESTUNES Editor, Vice-President SoCal East, Executive Vice-President, President 1992-93, Vice-President of Chapter Support and Leadership Training, Contest Administrator.

Sam Aramian died May 10, 2010. He was a 52 year member of the Society (Joined the Phoenix Saguaro Chapter in 1958). His accomplishments include President of Phoenix Chapter about 1962, FWD President 1968-69, Created the "President's Award" in 1969, International President 1977, "Voice Expression"/"Interpretation" Category Judge for 20 years. He also was the Baritone of the Desert Knights (a comedy quartet) since about 1959.

Gene Hartzler passed away in October 2010 at 95 years of age. He was a 45 year member of the Society. He served as District Secretary for 14 years, served as a COTS Instructor, served as Chapter Treasurer of the new El Cajon Chapter in 1965. He also guided the chapter through all the incorporation legalities and at the 1965 FWD Fall Convention in Phoenix he was presented with the El Cajon Chapter Charter by our old friend Don Galvin who was FWD President at that time.

Don McAvoy was Hall of Fame member number four to leave us in 2010. He died in mid-December at age 92. As District President he declared 1983 to be the "Year of the Quartet". He called for a 20% increase in registered quartets, increased quartet activity in every chapter and more quartets in competition. Don also served as "International Board Member " from the district in 1989. He was a retired U. S. Army Colonel who gave great service both to his country (Normandy Beach, Battle of the Bulge) and to his District.

Farewell gentlemen, you will always be remembered as good citizens and great "Barbershoppers."



2010 FWD Chorus Champions The Masters of Harmony

In November, the Masters of Harmony family was deeply saddened by the sudden passing of four-time MOH gold medalist Irv Levine. After becoming an emeritus member in 2003, Irv and his loving wife Lois continued their unabashed support of the Masters of Harmony. They provided many alwaysdelicious sandwiches that nourished members on recording session and show rehearsal days. Irv's meticulous editing skills helped all who write for the Masters look better in print. Nobody embodied the spirit of giving, sharing and caring found so widely throughout the barbershop world better than Irv. He will be missed but never forgotten by those whose lives he touched.

On October 30, the Masters put the finishing touches on a new recording to be released in May 2011. Entitled "The Dream is Carried On," it will feature religious, patriotic and other inspirational songs performed by the Masters of Harmony, The Westminster Chorus and both choruses combined.

In mid-November, the Masters were invited to perform in a two-day movie shoot in Long Beach. Chorus members learned first-hand how many times the commands "action" and "cut" were necessary to produce a working scene. It is not known at this time whether this concept filming will be expanded into a full-length movie.

For years, MOH members have wanted to present their Christmas season repertoire to more than two

audiences on a single day. This year they got their chance. A stunning performance in Riverside's Fox Theater in the spring, to inaugurate their first new concert season, resulted in an invitation to return for a Christmas show. The next day, the MOH family traveled to Bakersfield to perform a Christmas special that had been added to the Bakersfield Concert Series. A record 2,500 patrons attended that show, one of the largest Masters' audiences ever. The following Saturday, the Masters staged their regular Christmas shows, this time at Fullerton's Plummer Auditorium.

On January 8, 2011, the Masters held their Annual Awards and Installation Banquet, once again at Knott's Berry Farm Resort Hotel. Far Western District President Bernard Priceman presided over the installation of officers. Barbershop legend John Miller gave the keynote address. Patrick Claypool was named Barbershopper of the Year. When MOH choreography coach Justin Miller moved to Connecticut, Patrick agreed to take on the role Justin had filled so successfully. Since taking on this additional duty, Patrick has been hitting home runs consistently! The Edge received the chapter's Quartet of the Year award.

Since the last edition of Westunes, Matt Bohy, Michael Norcross, Satoshi Suga, Jude Thomas, Jake Tickner and Kyle Williamson were welcomed into membership.

I feel challenged every now and then to make sure that I do not repeat myself in my allotted space in Westunes. As I start my fifth year as your division VP, I started to think about, "Okay, think of something new to write about." And then it dawned on me that is exactly what I need to write about.

Think of something new. It isn't always easy, but it is something we should all try doing often. Like most of you, I wear many different hats in life: husband, father, employee, quartet singer, chorus director, district officer. If I continued to take the same approach day in and day out in any one of those roles, I would be in trouble real fast -- and most likely fail. That does not mean there is no value in being consistent. But a failure to adapt, to think of and to try new ways of doing things leads to complacency, boredom, or just acceptance of the status quo.

I have written on this page more than once in the past few years for each of you to think about what you like about your barbershop experience and, more importantly, what could make it even better. I have invited readers of this column to write or phone me with your thoughts and suggestions, and I have implored you to share your thoughts with your chapter leaders as well. Let me be frank: the response has been underwhelming. Now a positive way to look at that would be to say, "Wow! Things are going great in all the chapters. No one has a complaint. No one feels the need to suggest a change." But I know that would be an incorrect conclusion because I look at data that tells me differently every month.

Gentleman, our membership numbers are plummeting. I do not use that word lightly. And it seems that few even care. I am sure that is not the case, but I am not sure how else to explain a couple of hard facts. The first fact I already mentioned: the lack of suggestions, ideas, or even just venting about membership woes or anything else that may be on the minds of the members. The second fact: only two chapters in our division sent their Membership VP/Chapter Development VP to Leadership Academy. I find it hard to believe that only two chapters feel that membership is not one of their top priorities. If you are surprised that only two chapters attended the membership class, ask your chapter leadership if anyone from your chapter attended.

Now I am sure a few of you are now saying, "For goodness sake, Steve, lighten up!" I can't. I'm forty-nine years old and looking at a dim future where the Barbershop Harmony Society will not exist by the time I retire. That sounds a little selfish and self-centered, but I know men even younger than me who face the same uncertain future (including my 12-year-old son). The loss of the barbershop society is a real possibility if we do not all work together to think of something new to turn the tide. If even just 5% of the members of our division thought of one new idea to improve their chapter experience or attract new members (they actually go hand-in-hand), that would be over twenty new ideas to try. That's far more than the number of ideas that I have received in the past four years. Don't worry about overwhelming me with calls and emails; I will happily bear that burden!

Division Convention and Contest: Please remember that our convention and contest this year is being held jointly with the FWD Spring Convention in Santa Clara across the weekend of March 17-20. If you have not registered yet, please do so as soon as possible. Quartets and choruses also need to make sure they submit their CJ-20 contest entry forms. At press time, we only had two choruses and three quartets signed up for the contest. This is a great opportunity to showcase your quartet and chorus for a larger audience than our usual division contests. If you have not had the chance to sing on the contest stage at a district convention, this is your chance. I promise you will have a great time singing for a very supportive and appreciative audience.

I look forward to seeing you ALL in Santa Clara. Let's sing a tag or a song while we discuss how together we can address the challenges we face. I love singing barbershop and I love the Barbershop Harmony Society. I know you all do, too. Let's get to work on making sure the next generation will have a BHS their entire lives as well
