CONVENTION CHATTER!

Are you going to the International Convention in Las Vegas this summer? If so, great!

We look forward to seeing you. If not, WHY not?

For over a year we have been telling you about all the neat things that will be happening at this year's convention. There's barely going to be enough time to do the things available at the convention much less do all the things offered in and around Las Vegas.

Rooms are available at an extremely low rate for a major hotel in the Las Vegas area and they are throwing in free parking! We would have loved to have had that in Toronto. You can find all price ranges for food -- from very expensive to free and everything in between. There are shows up and down the Strip.

There are youth activities right across the street as well as up and down the Strip. If you don't like the gambling side of Vegas, you don't have to be involved in it. YOU have choices! YOU have control!

A couple of **Westunes** ago I challenged you to attend the convention for two reasons: (1) it's happening in your own district and (2) we have several district quartets and choruses that need your support. I guess this didn't make much of an impression on many of you because registration numbers still aren't coming anywhere near hoped-for levels.

What is it going to take to get you to attend the BHS International Convention? It normally only comes to or near our district every four or five years so this is your chance to attend without a lot of travel involved. Hotel costs are as cheap as they have been in years. The BHS continues to add events and HarmonyU classes to spice up the pot but they can't add much more in the way of these new events or

classes because there are just not enough time slots left in the week to place them.

This year the entire convention is in one hotel! You never have to leave the building unless you want to. There are no buses to mess with between events...and no going outside to contend with the 'warm' summer Las Vegas weather.

After last year's convention was held out of the country, resulting in much higher costs for many of us, one would have expected that this year should have been one of the best attended conventions in recent years due to the really good rates that the society negotiated. Good prices, convenience, and all the trimmings and still we are not seeing Toronto's numbers as of this writing. Why?

Sure the registration fee has gone up over the years (but not this year!). It pretty much had to go up. The BHS has been adding events and classes to try and boost convention attendance. These things cost additional money. If you don't attend the convention, this cost gets passed on to those who do in the form of higher registration fees. If these fees get too high, people who have been attending the convention for years may be priced out of attending future conventions thus continuing this cycle of rising registration costs.

At some point there simply won't be an International Convention to attend. Why should the BHS and a host chapter go through all the work and expense of putting on a convention if no one is going to attend? How about we just hold the contests in an empty theater with a canned applause track and send them out via the webcast?

Meetings could be held on computers using one of the many software packages currently available. This way you save all that money you would have spent on travel, food and registration fees and the Society will save all that money they currently spend on bringing you the best International Convention possible. I just painted a picture of something that most of us hope to never see. But, it could happen! You can help support the society, its programs and their International Convention by your attendance; and even more, by volunteering some of your time while at the convention to help make it run smoothly. This convention doesn't run without volunteer help. If the society had to hire people to fill all the positions that the volunteers currently fill, registration fees would be more like a \$1,000 per person. If you are interested in volunteering some of your time, please go to the Convention web page on the BHS website and click on the volunteer button. It will take you to our local convention site where you'll find the place to volunteer.

We're planning a *great* convention and offering so many fun things to do that you will probably wonder where all your time went. But, no matter how much we provide for you, it doesn't mean a thing if you don't attend and partake of all these offerings.

We have enough room in the Grand Garden Arena to seat well over 10,000 people. Let's not waste all that great space. There isn't a bad seat in the house, so let's fill 'er up! Please register for and attend the 2014 BHS International Convention this summer in Las Vegas.

2014 Youth Harmony Camp

HARMONY CAMP 2014

September 19th – 21st
Pollock Pines, CA

As members of your chapter you are aware of the positive impact Harmony Camp has on boys and indirectly our communities. Over the past 11 years, 825 young men have attended Youth Harmony Camp in Pollock Pines. Many of these young men are now active members of barbershop chapters and / or participating in college or community choral programs.

This year, at the request of music educators who have attended camp in the past, we will provide a woodshedding class with additional time for tag singing which the boys love.

Our target attendance for 2014 is 100 boys and we can use your assistance. Harmony Foundation (HF) has funded camps like ours around the country using a formula of roughly \$50 per camper which is approximately 24% of our funding. This year HF has changed their method of supporting Camps with a shift to an emphasis on "new camps" and "growth of camps". We are not new, and we are growing, but not rapidly. The projected dollar amount per camper from HF will be lower in 2014 than in the past.

The FWD Harmony Camp is a very successful Camp. The historical roots of the FWD Camp go back to the actual creation of the camp concept by none other than Lloyd Steinkamp. All the other camps around the country followed the lead of the FWD camp and most of them are run as an arm of the Society. Those are the camps called Harmony Explosion Camps. The FWD Harmony Camp and a few others around the country are independent of the Society. We set our own rules, and receive no direct assistance from the Society.

Long term we are planning on launching a far reaching campaign to raise money for an endowment fund for Harmony Camp. This is an idea that has been percolating for some time and has received strong support from our BHS CEO, Marty Monson. In fact, I met with Marty one on one at Harmony University last summer and he challenged me to undertake this project, and I am excited to do so! More on this later; but I wanted you to be aware of this coming soon.

Dates for this year's Camp are September 19-21, 2014, and we have Lunch Break as our headliner quartet. We have Gabe Caretto, Music Dean, Jim Halvorson, Ron Black and Joe Cerutti (director of Alexandria Harmonizers and recently a member of the Society staff as YIH and Chorus Director Development).

Camp information and application forms are available on the FWD website http://farwesterndistrict.org/youth-harmony-camp. We

depend on you to assist us in recruiting boys or provide contact leads for us to contact them (choral directors or individuals).

Should you have questions or wish to provide information on Music Educators or individuals to whom we can send Camp information, don't hesitate to call or email me. Music Educators are welcome and encouraged to join us at camp for all or part of the weekend at our expense.

Gene Clements - Convention Honoree 2104 Spring Convention in Riverside

"Just the facts, in the words of Gene Clements: (ed.)"

1967: Charter member of a new Mid-Atlantic District (MAD) chapter in Frederick, MD. Chorus: CATOCTONES...this was the start of my love of barbershop. Subsequently, I became Assistant Musical Director, the Director for 5 years. Served on the Board of Directors (BOD) as Vice President, then President and received the Barbershopper of the Year award (BOTY) for that. Held various other responsibilities such as Show Chairman. The 1976 Bi-centennial show was my "pride."

1970: Became interim director for a newly chartered Sweet Adelines International (ASI) chapter in Frederick. Chorus: Heart of Maryland. Served as "interim" director for 10 years, Region 14, I believe, and won the small chorus championship. In November 1980 I moved back to

Mission Viejo, California. Joined the then Santa Ana GOLDEN CITY CHORUS and became its Musical Director for 5 years in 1981, succeeding Bill Harper. Proud that Brett Littlefield joined the chapter / chorus while I was directing and "taught hem everything he knows" (grin). NOTE: The Santa Ana Chapter folded in the early nineties and was relocated and renamed the WESTMINSTER CHAPTER / CHORUS, a very small group that was later latched onto by a bunch of young guys who ultimately brought it International recognition.

Circa 1983, I became the Musical Director of the SAI Garden Grove chapter, "Cities of Harmony" for 3 years or so and placed 6th in Region 21, circa 1985. Proud that Pam Pieson, Lead of PANACHE / Director of HARBORLITES, joined while I was directing. It was also in 1983 that my wife and soul mate, Wanda, was singing with the Mission Viejo SAI chapter and won an International third place chorus medal in Phoenix; our family's first chorus medal.

In November 1987, desperately wanting a more broad and more meaningful singing experience, I attended the first rehearsal / gathering of the then Foothills Cities Chapter under the direction of DR. GREG LYNE. I joined the MASTERS OF HARMONY (MOH) in December 1987 and we won the FWD chorus competition in October 1988. (In 1971, at the New Orleans International, I vowed to my family that I would one day sing on the International stage and I knew it would now happen.) The MOH went to its first International in Kansas City in 1989 and placed 4th. A medal! Wow! Now, I proudly own eight (8) International Chorus gold medals. Who wudda ever thought!

I've been with MOH for 25 wonderful years. In that span, I've served the chapter in various capacities such as Employment Manager, Business Agent, mentor to new men, awards committee member, nomination committee member and Instructor in vocal techniques for Masters University. Though asked to serve on the MOH BOD several times, I declined. I just wanted to sing. I didn't want to be

"tied up" in chapter administrative activities. However, during those years, I did serve as Musical Director and coach for the then Saddleback chapter, California Promise Chorus, during a reorganization period and had also coached choruses and quartets.

Circa 1994, I was asked, and accepted, to become an Area Counselor and was awarded Area Counselor of the Year in 1996. I became more active in the Chapter Support and Leadership Training program and was again honored by the FWD as Chapter Counselor of the Year in 2003.

Several years ago, I was contacted by both Lloyd Steinkamp and John Krizek to become a FWD BOD member. I declined, as I just wanted to sing and not be "tied up" in FWD administrative activities.

They contacted me again the following year and being "pressured in a friendly way" by Unka Lloyd, I agreed to serve my district as a Division Vice President for (now) the Southeast Division. I served in that capacity for four years, declining to serve my fifth year for family reasons. I also served on the FWD's Nomination Committee. During my Vice-Presidency, and after, I had the pleasure of installing officers for many, many chapters and providing guidance on sensitive chapter and membership challenges when asked or deemed necessary.

I've truly had a wonderful barbershopping life.

The last few months have been very busy in Barbershop land. Valentine's Day followed right after the Westunes spring deadline. I had a great time

with good friends delivering Singing Valentines all around our area. I love the joy and warmth in the faces of our unsuspecting victims when they hear that first chord. It's a pretty good chapter fund raiser too.

The NorCal Novice and Mixed Quartet contest on Feb 22 was very successful. The NorCal Novice champ was **Brannigan** and the Mixed Quartet champ was **The Cat's Meow**. **The Golden Valley Chorus** has hosted this contest in Ripon for the past several years under the leadership of Bruce Sellnow and Howard

Barber. There is a strong rumor that the **Devil Mountain Chorus** in Walnut Creek will host the contest next year with the two chapters alternating in future years. Walnut Creek hosted this novice competition for many years – I remember singing in the contest in 1985.

The FWD Spring Convention on Mar 20-23 in Riverside was the next big item on my agenda. The **Gas Light Chorus** did a terrific job hosting and the renovated Fox Theater in Downtown Riverside was a wonderful venue for the quartet and chorus contests. You can read the detail elsewhere, but FWD is sending five quartets to the Intl contest from Riverside and two others have qualified out of district for a total of seven! This may be a record.

My chapter is competing in the 2014 NE/NW Division Contests at the Hutchins Street Square in Lodi on May 17, 2014 with the Stockton Chapter hosting. The contest will be all over by the time you read this but I'm sure it was terrific. Both **Voices in Harmony** and **Voices of California** will perform the contest set that they plan to use at the International Convention in Las Vegas. You are going to be in Vegas aren't you? Our seven FWD Quartets and four FWD Choruses can use all the local support they can get.

I wrote last time that one of our FWD goals this year is to revitalize our Chapter Coaching Program including musical coaching. In addition to the existing coach partial travel reimbursement budget, the FWD BOD is considering a plan to fund coaching for up to five chapters. Eligible chapters would be those that have scored between 50 and 59.9 at their last contest appearance since 2009. The chapters would be offered four free coaching sessions before May 2015. In return for this coaching, the chapters would commit to competing in their respective 2015 Division Chorus Contests, and if they score high enough to qualify for District, the 2015 District Chorus Contest as well. Our analysis shows that chapters that sing in the 60s at contest attract more singers and have more successful shows and sing-outs than those that do not. There appears be a real sweet spot at that threshold. purpose of this program is to get more chapters singing in the 60s. Stay tuned for details.

Harmony Foundation deserves the support of every member at whatever level they can manage. Large corporate donors look at how well a charity is supported by its members and they do not commit until the percentage gets above 50% or so. It is not the dollars given by members they look at – we do pretty well that way – it is the number of members that give. Although the trend is moving up, we are below 20% of our members participating. Please help.

I hope your spring chapter shows were successful! I also hope that you are looking for ways to support your local school music programs. I will see you in Las Vegas in July and at the FWD District Convention in Fresno this coming October.

However, may I suggest you lead the conversation in a direction that will encourage the attendee to talk about their passions, and the community activities in which they participate. Would they have an interest in having a barbershop group perform for them? In other words, what can we do for them? Don't worry that this may not be your local community. Share the information with the local chapter.

In closing I challenge each chapter to take stock of your community service activities. What are your current community service activities? Share your activities and ideas with other chapters. Dear chorus directors,

A noted choral director, Dr. Howard Swan was once asked, "what one piece of advice would you give to

choral conductors?" He responded with a listing of some attributes he felt a conductor should possess but concluded by saying that "a choral conductor should always be enthusiastic!" What an important message this sends!

Our very own FWD leader, Nick Papageorge, was a student of Howard Swan while in classes at Occidental College. So, I asked Nick to share how he felt Dr. Swan transmitted enthusiasm to him and other students. Here is Nick's response:

He WAS enthusiastic. But it wasn't a rah-rah enthusiastic. He was enthusiastic about music and life! He wanted every singer to feel the importance of every note, every chord, and to feel the emotion of the music. Everything about Howard was his psychological "life lessons." Howard targeted tone quality, ensemble singing through story telling and imagery.

I now try to give to my students some of the same lessons I learned through observing Dr. Swan. I tell them stories, stress the importance of emotion just as Howard taught me. I remember everything about Howard. He influenced me profoundly.

What a testament to a great teacher Nick provides us here. So, here's the question..

Are you/we taking into our rehearsals our best enthusiasm about life and the importance of music-making? If so, congratulations! Shall we all guess this lesson from Dr. Swan and Nick might be key to even higher levels of rehearsal/performance for your chorus, and, perhaps, an even greater level of personal satisfaction for you as a director?

As Dr. Swan said, "be enthusiastic!"

All best wishes to each of you. Your enthusiasm may just make a difference.

In the last issue of Westunes this column dealt with marketing and PR suggestions for chapter M&PR officers, particularly those new to the job. (If you missed it, you can find the Westunes link on the FWD Website home page. Go there, then

click on PDF at the upper right and it will take you to back issues of Westunes.)

That column suggested that getting help with the large and important job of chapter marketing and PR is Rule Number 1, and Rule Number 2 is to never forget Rule Number 1.

That brings us to Rule Number 3, which is to not reinvent the wheel unless you are a very creative and inventive guy. There is a lot of useful information and great ideas available, so take a look at those before you struggle with a plan of your own to market and publicize your chapter, chorus and quartets.

Start by going to the BHS Website (barbershop.org/home/html). At the top, click on Resources, then Document Center and scroll down to Marketing. There you'll find categories for Audio PSAs, Marketing and Public Relations and Marketing Matters, each with a number of articles or recordings to help your marketing and public relations.

The Audio folder, for instance, contains 27 short public service announcement recordings that you can use to publicize an upcoming show, patriotic holiday performance and other events. The recordings are generic, so you'll need to add specific information for the program that you want to publicize. Radio stations, particularly in smaller communities, may be willing to help you with localizing the recordings and will play them on their station as PSAs.

The Marketing and PR link contains some very helpful information such as a Chapter Marketing Ideas Manual, how to Get Free Publicity, Marketing Barbershop Performances, News Release Basics and Social Media for Barbershop Quartets and Choruses, among other useful topics.

Marketing Matters includes quarterly reports discussing specific marketing ideas, some of which are included in the Marketing and PR link listed above. They were sent out in 2011 and 2012 so they may be a little outdated but still worth taking a look at to see if they get marketing/PR ideas flowing for you and your team.

Summarizing the last column and this one: Don't do it alone and get great ideas on how to do it from BHS.

2013 FWD Chorus Champions Masters of Harmony

The Barbershop Harmony Society's Midwinter Convention is a showcase of barbershop harmony talent and the 2014 Midwinter, which was no exception, featured some of best groups ever assembled for the event. On stage were the current International Quartet Champion, Masterpiece, as well as other 2013 International medalist quartets, Seniors quartet competitors, and 20 youth choruses from around the country. The Masters of Harmony were especially honored to close the Friday night events with a four-song set that brought the late evening but still enthusiastic audience to its feet with thunderous applause. Other performers with an MOH connection included: The Velvet Frogs (Les Dergan, David Livingston, and C.J. Sams); Zachary Green and Ernie Reyes in the 3rd Street Sound youth chorus led by Carol Stephenson; Boom Town Chorus with Joey Buss and Jake Tickner; and the Cal State Fullerton's Men's Choir directed by Dr. Chris Peterson. In 1990, the Masters parlayed a successful performance at the Tucson Midwinter to International gold later that year in San Francisco. Current members hope for a similar springboard effect this summer in Las Vegas!

On February 15, Mark Freedkin's passion for introducing young men from throughout Southern California to harmony singing in the barbershop style resulted in another highly successful Young Men's Harmony Festival at Orange Coast College. This year, 148 young men from 20 Southern California high schools attended the daylong events. More than 75% were first-timers and several new schools were added to the mix. After warmups led by Dr. Chris Peterson, the young men received choral training from coaches with impressive performance credentials such as OC Times, Masterpiece and The Newfangled Four. Dr. Peterson told the choral music teachers in attendance how they could use barbershop harmony to attract more young men to their programs. The evening show featured performances from the youth chorus, several smaller ensembles, OC Times, The Newfangled Four, Masterpiece, and the Masters of Harmony. The finale featured over 320 singers filling the risers to overflowing for numbers that wowed the audience of nearly 250 parents, families, teachers and friends. Those attending this year's event brought the 14-year event total to over 3,000 students who have participated in one or more of the festivals. This eagerly awaited festival is a unique opportunity to enhance the limited music education most of the young men receive. It can create a life-long desire to join groups with other like-minded singers – maybe in a barbershop chorus near you! After all, look what ringing chords did for a quarrelsome set of school board members who found both musical and personal harmony when they sang about ice cream (Meredith Willson's *The Music Man*, 1957)!

President **Ron Andreas**'s innovative badging ceremony continues to enhance the spirit of MOH brotherhood. Family members and friends are invited to witness the presentation of the member's nametag in front of the chorus. Immediate family members and other guests witnessed badge ceremonies held for **Robert Shelton and Brandon McNabb**. **James Halvorson**'s mother and father came in from Las Vegas to be with him for his special evening. James literally carries barbershop genes wherever he goes. His dad sings with the 2012 FWD Quartet Champion **95 North**. As Ron noted, "Each new member we welcome into our family puts the breath of life into the sails of our chorus."

The Far Western District's Spring Convention, held at Riverside's Fox Performing Arts Center, featured six different contests. Masters of Harmony singers performed in nine of the 27 quartets and eight of the 16 choruses. The FWD will be sending six quartets to Las Vegas this summer and two are MOH quartets – The Crush (Matt Gray, John Brockman, Paul Tabone) and Southeast Division Quartet Champion American Pastime (Graham Pence, Tom Moore, Matt Swann, Joe D'Amore). The following MOH quartets qualified for the FWD District Quartet Contest in Fresno this fall: Southwest Division Seniors Quartet Champion Blood, Sweat and Years (Les Weiser, Bob Cathaway), West 7 Four (Justin Miller, Jason Remley, Patrick Claypool), Southeast Division Novice Quartet Champion Flightline (Cody Littlefield, Kyle Williamson). More than 50 percent of the judges were MOH members. The Westminster Chorus, with several dozen MOH dual members, followed up its stunning performance at the Western Division of the American Choral Directors Association convention with another world-class performance to win the chorus competition en route to another try for gold in 2015.

In March, **Erin Howden** worked with the Masters over a two-day period to create a stunning, high-energy package for the Las Vegas uptune. New members quickly discovered why the word *genius* is not a misnomer when applied to Erin's ability to create appropriate dynamic moves that blend sight and sound in ways that enthrall audiences. A highlight of the second evening with Erin was the badge ceremony for **Aaron Jaramillo**. Since Aaron's parents were in Denver and his girlfriend had an important presentation to make elsewhere, it looked like Aaron would be the first to stand by himself for his special night. Well, Erin was not the only one who acted creatively that night. Members Ernie Reyes, **Ryan Collins** and Ron Andreas used FaceTime to create a video hookup with Aaron's mother and she not only witnessed the ceremony in absentia but was able to witness the chorus's run-through of Erin's work!

Special congratulations go to Director **Justin Miller** who announced his engagement to **Andrea Christensen**. The couple plans a June wedding. The Masters family knows exactly the kind of gold that would make a great wedding gift!
