

#### Track 1: Craft - Wyndham, Havasupai Room

**Vowel Matching** is a key to making your quartet and chorus sound better. Come learn and experience what this technique will do for you. (Ray Rhymer: 1 hour)

**Vocal Production** is general instruction, followed by individual coaching, for several volunteers while the less adventuresome watch and learn. You'll learn how to produce the best sound along with how your vocal apparatus really works. (Bill Pearson: 2 hours)

# Convention Dedicated To



Perry is the first of four children born to Sam and Virg Aramian in Chicago on April 23 (William Shakespeare's purported birthday), in 1944. This was nine months and three days after his parents were married. Terry attended Schneider Elementary School where, in the fourth grade, he finished second in a class Howdy Doody look-alike contest. It was a proud day, indeed.

He joined SPEBSQSA in 1959, and formed a high school quartet as his favorite pastime when he was not occupied with his studies in Math and Science.

Terry is a quartet man (Music Appreciation 101, Sound Committee), a chorus director (Tucson, San Jose, Palomar-Pacific), Singing Judge, Coach, and Emcee. A long-time member of Greater Phoenix

Chapter, he has also topped the rosters — alphabetically — of the Tucson, Reno, Fresno, San Jose, Palomar-Pacific chapters.

Besides just being a barbershop icon in general, Terry has been a great leader and has held key Society positions including International Board Member, International Vice President, International Treasurer, and International President. At the chapter level he has served as Chapter President, Chapter Program Vice President, and Chapter Membership Vice President. He was on the Harmony Foundation Board of Trustees, as President during times of radical change. He has been in the Judging arena for 15+ years, as Sound and later Singing Judge.

His leisure activities include golf, private pilot, wining, dining, women & travel — not necessarily in that order. He has traveled to the Mideast, the Fareast, and Central and Western Europe, including Italy, England, Germany, Netherlands, France, Thailand, Philippines, and Singapore. Eleanor Roosevelt would be proud.

Terry is alive and kicking and survives along with his parents, three siblings, four children (no barbershoppers among them), and six grandchildren. He has been employed as a scorpion milker, insurance underwriter, insurance agent, electrician, electrical contractor, expert witness to the construction trades, and realtor.

When day is done he will be remembered for being a nice guy, affable, a leader, and a fair but tough decision maker. But today we celebrate our love and affection for this barbershopper's barbershopper, and proudly dedicate this convention in his honor.

### JUDGING

Contest Administrator ... Mike Lanctot (Evergreen District) Assoc. Contest Adm. ..... Zif Palagyi (Far Western District)

Music ...... Jeremain Pope (Evergreen District) Marty Israel (Mid-Atlantic District) Ron Black (SouthWestern District)

Judges in this category adjudicate the musical elements in the performance: melody, harmony, range and tessitura, tempo and rhythm and meter, construction and form, and embellishments. They judge the extent to which the musical performance displays the hallmarks of the barbershop style, and the degree to which the musical performance demonstrates an artistic sensitivity to the music's primary theme.

Presentation ...... Dwain Brobst (SouthWestern District) Bob Hodges (SouthWestern District) Gary Wulf (Johnny Appleseed District)

These judges evaluate how effectively a performer brings the song to life. They respond to both the visual and vocal aspects of the presentation, to evaluate the interaction of these aspects in creating the image of the song, as well as everything about the performance that contributes to emotional impact upon the audience.

Singing ......James Estes (Land O' Lakes District) Ig Jakovac (Mid-Atlantic District) J. Richards (Land O' Lakes District)

Judges in this category evaluate the degree to which the performer achieves artistic singing in the barbershop style: the production of vibrant, rich, resonant, technically accurate, and highly skilled sound, created both by the individual singer's use of good vocal techniques, and by the ensemble processes of tuning, balancing, unity of sound and precision. They listen for a sense of precise intonation, a feeling of fullness or expansion of sound, a perception of a high degree of vocal skill, a high level of unity and consistency throughout the performance, and a freedom from apparent effort that allows the full communication of the lyric and song.

Each judge may award up to 100 points per song.

loyd loved entertainment, laughter, and applause. The members of Metropolis, The Perfect Gentlemen, and Hi-Fidelity are honored to have received many "pearls" from Lloyd over the years. We feel that many of his teachings helped us become the quartets we are today.

With Lloyd's passing earlier this year, we felt it was truly fitting that a special award be created to honor everyone's uncle, and hero, Lloyd Steinkamp, and also appropriate that the inaugural presentation of this award be made at the Fall Convention in Lloyd's hometown of Phoenix, Arizona.

The award is the LLOYD B. STEINKAMP - STANDING "O" AWARD. This new award will be presented to the quartet that has been judged as being the most entertaining at the FWD Fall Contest each year. Each quartet that

performs on Friday evening will be eligible for the award. Members of our quartets, along with 100 audience members, will take part in the selection process. The votes will be tallied on Saturday afternoon, and the winner will be announced Saturday evening at the Show of Champions.

The winning quartet will receive the perpetual Standing "O" trophy, along with some very handsome lapel pins to wear proudly. The winning quartet will donate their time to assist at a FWD Youth Harmony Camp.

Should you be approached to be one of the judges for this award, remember that this award is in Lloyd's honor, and that the most entertaining quartet from Friday night's semi-final competition will be the proud recipient of this special award. You'll be doing what Lloyd asked us to do ... be a giver.

This award is to perpetuate Lloyd's contributions to the world of barbershopping, by honoring those who strive to entertain at the highest level.

loyd was the consummate performer. It was a part of his being that was always with him. Whenever he had an audience, whether one or 10,000, he was performing. He had a tremendous beginning in professional stage and theater before he discovered barbershopping. He was featured, and in some cases starred, in radio programs such as "The Children's Hour" (NBC), "The Shadow"; "Coast to Coast On A Bus" (NBC); "The Kate Smith Hour" (CBS); "Adventures of Ellery Queen" (CBS); and many on-Broadway plays such as "Abe Lincoln in Illinois" with Raymond Massey, and "Blind Alley", with George Colouris. It's not too surprising that his on-stage talents eventually led to acting and directing with the New York Theater Guild and then directing with ABC-TV in New York City.

Lloyd was a barbershopper for more than 60 years, joining the Society in 1945 in Washington, D.C., but due to his naval responsibilities and the war, he never really had the chance to enjoy it until 1955, when the Steinkamp family moved to Phoenix, Arizona. The rest, as they say, is legendary: director, coach, arranger, judge, chapter officer, division officer, district officer, international officer ... Lloyd did it all, and in 1974 he was inducted into the FWD Hall of Fame.

In February 1956, the *Desert Knights* were formed with Lloyd, Russ Scholtz, Chuck Rastatter and Joe Salz. In October 1957, they won the Far Western District championship. Somewhere along the line Sam Aramian replaced Russ Scholtz, and that foursome remained intact, eventually to become the Society's longest standing quartet with the same four guys. And then there was *Music Appreciation 101*, among the funniest quartets of all time; even today, one need only mention "Wagon Wheel" in barbershop circles to get a round of belly laughs started.

In 1966, Lloyd was hired by the Society to be its first traveling international representative. For the next ten years or so, Lloyd traveled the country, establishing new chapters and revitalizing existing chapters. By the late 1970s, Lloyd was probably known by more barbershoppers than just about anybody in the Society.

In addition to his administrative interests, Lloyd was an accomplished barbershop arranger and Music Judge, having arranged over 350 barbershop songs and over 250 Glee Club and liturgical songs. The song that propelled the Phoenicians to their first gold medal, *Ring to the Name of Rose*, was Lloyd's arrangement, and he arranged many other songs for the Phoenicians and others over the years. In 1977 he was appointed to the Society's Board of Review in the Arrangement Category and then in 1980 became the International Contest and Judging Arrangement Category Specialist. In 1983 he became the Society's International Contest and Judging Chairman. He was appointed as the FWD DACJC in 1985, and in 1988 he was honored at the International Contest and Judging meetings in Atlanta for being the longest certified scoring judge in the history of the Society.

In his final years, Lloyd's energies were focused on music for the youth of tomorrow. He was appointed as the Society Youth Outreach Vice-Chairman, and besides all the wonderful anecdotes, fond memories, and magnificent arrangements he left with us earlier this year when God called him home, perhaps his greatest legacy will be made evident each year at International, where you'll get a chance to see "Uncle Lloyd's Kids" make us all proud.

### Championship Rankings Plateau Titles

The following score-based plateau titles will be awarded to choruses competing in the divisional contests. The average score of the two most recent appearances in any of the three past Fall District Chorus Contests will determine the plateau placement as follows:

**Plateau AAA:** Average triple panel score of 1278 (71%) or higher, or any chorus returning to competition after winning the International Chorus Championship. Choruses with an average score less than 1278 may voluntarily place themselves into this plateau.

**Plateau AA**; Average triple panel score from 1098 (61%) through 1277 (70.94%). Choruses scoring less than 1098 may voluntarily place themselves into this plateau.

**Plateau A:** Choruses that have not competed in any of the three most recent Fall District Chorus Contests or have an average triple panel score of less than 1098 (61%), with the exception of any chorus returning to competition after winning the International Chorus Championship.


