The Far Western District Spring Convention in brief.... Sparks, Nevada. March 18-21, 2004

FOUR (Maybe More?) TO LOUISVILLE!

Achieving the "magic number" of 2736 points (76%) in Sparks at the Far Western District International Quartet Preliminary contest were:

GOTCHA!	(3209, 89.1%)
Metropolis	(3130, 86.9%)
Q	(2877, 79.9%)
Hi-Fidelity	(2790, 77.5%)

And, missing it by a mere .02% was the up-and-coming quartet from Westminster and MOH, **O.C.Times**. (Watch out next year!)

Still to come are the results of the FWD quartets that have chosen to compete out of District: **Finale** (competing in Evergreen District) and **Broadway** (competing in Sunshine District). Stay tuned for the results!

In FWD's first combination Spring Prelim-NorCal East Divisional, 19 quartets trod the boards with some opting for the Prelims, some for the Divisional and some for both.

The top NorCal East Quartet and qualifying for the Fall district contest was **WhirlWind** (Stockton and Santa Rosa).

Reno' *Silver Dollar Chorus* bested second place **Fresno** by a mere 3 points to win (again) the NorCal East Chorus Contest.

The High School Quartet Contest, which was judged by **Gotcha** and **Metropolis**, found four good-sounding young quartets vying for the crown. **The Burninators** took the gold with **Let It Ride, Namesake**, and **B Sharp** close behind. Awards were presented by last year's top High School Quartet Da *Isle Tones*, of Honolulu, Hawaii.

CONVENTION AWARDS

The convention was dedicated to long-time (over 45 year) Society member and Fullerton Chapter member, **Stan French**! At an active age of 87, he attributes his longevity to the three "B's": *Barbershopping, vitamin B and Budweiser*, in that order.

Past President John Krizek' **President's Award** was presented to a very surprised **Ellie and Deane Scoville** (Fullerton Chapter) for their continuous and active support of the district and the hobby. And, almost immediately after, **Deane** was inducted into the prestigious **FWD Hall Of Fame** by **Joe Saltz** and the near-dozen current members of HOF who were in attendance.

Placerville was named "*Chapter Of The Year*," as a result of their fine efforts in behalf of Barbershopping as a whole demonstrating leadership within FWD.

- To approve a one-time reduction of the seating requirement for the Fall 2007 convention from 3000 to 2300.
- To modify the budget to permit additional funds for COTS, Financial Development and Leadership Forum attendance.
